Code of Code in our zoom assemblies

The children have also been learning the signs used by deaf peers and adults at school and hopefully they will be able to teach you these signs when they get home.

With so much going on regarding COVID-19, it has been wonderful to look at the work being done by the children. Here are just a few photos of things that we have seen around school.








